Project Aims:	The Culinary Medicine Team (CMT) at George Washington University (GW) has deployed the Health meets Food (HMF) culinary medicine curriculum, an innovative in-person didactic nutrition education model with hands-on cooking classes used by over 60 academic medical centers across the country. The CMT has demonstrated effectiveness in translating nutrition research and Mediterranean diet principles into practical use for home kitchens with demonstrated outcomes of increased (1) food security; (2) socialization; (3) nutrition knowledge, (4) cooking habits and culinary skills; and (5) improved health outcomes for diverse senior (60+) populations. In partnership with the GW

Center for Aging, Health and Humanities (CAHH), the District of Columbia's Department of Aging and Community Living (DACL), and Giant Foods Home Grocery Delivery Program (GF), the CMT will test a virtual version of the HMF curriculum for seniors in Washington, DC. The goal of this project (Type B) is to test the efficacy of HMF programming as a tool for improving nutrition and health outcomes with seniors using a virtual delivery model for hands-on cooking classes.

The objectives are to: (1) determine feasibility of a virtually-delivered program (asynchronous didactic and synchronous hands-on cooking classes); (2) assess participant experience utilizing food delivery service and online grocery ordering; and (3) demonstrate that the virtual programming has a similarly significant impact for seniors (compared to the in-person classes) on outcome measures.

**Outcome:** Scored 70; but unfunded.

**Project Aims:** ***The purpose of this study is to develop and test three brief behavioral checklists for dyadic real-time meal observations to assess both staff and resident behaviors for clinical use and application.*** Therefore, the *specific aims* of this secondary data analysis study are to:

**Aim 1:** Develop three brief checklists to assess: 1) staff person-centered care, 2) staff task-centered care, and 3) resident challenging behaviors at mealtime, applying Item-Response Theory and Classical Test Theory to previously coded video-taped interactions of full meals (n = 252 videos). A 3-point Likert scale format will be used to rate each behavior coded using the CUED: 0=unobserved, 1=1-2 times, 2=3+ times.

**Aim 2:** Establish feasibility, and intra- and inter-rater reliability of the three brief mealtime behavioral checklists with two different time intervals: (1) the full meal and (2) the first 10-minutes of the same meal.

**Aim 3:** Establish criterion validity of the three brief mealtime behavioral checklists for the two time intervals (full meal and 10 minutes) by comparing results to previously coded CUED and MES results.

**Outcome:** Proposal scored very well, but just outside funding range for this cycle. Program Director emailed after Reviewer Feedback received and encourage us to resubmit during the next cycle with a strengthened Impact-Risk and Work Plan sections (Scored Very Good (4)).

All other elements of the proposal scored Exceptional (1), Outstanding (2), or Excellent (3).
